9 Advisory Committee;
10 • provides for membership of the Ad Hoc committee; and
11 • specifies the duties and responsibilities of the Ad Hoc committee.

26 **Title.**

27 This proposal is known as the “Youth & Community Engagement Advisory Committee.”

28
29 **Youth & Community Engagement Advisory Committee – Creation – Membership –**
30 **Quorum – Duties – Report.**

31 (1) There is created an Ad Hoc committee called the Youth & Community Engagement
32 Advisory Committee consisting of the following 16 members:

33 (a) One member from each of Utah County's fifteen Legislative Districts, each of
34 whom shall be currently registered Republicans and live within the appointing
35 Legislative District; and

36 (b) One person who is a registered Republican, residing within the boundaries of
37 Utah County, who is appointed by the UCRP Chair.

38 (2)(a) The Legislative District Chair from each of the Utah County Republican Party's
39 fifteen Legislative Districts may designate a registered Republican, other than
40 him/herself, appointed under Subsection (1)(a), to sit on the Ad Hoc committee.

41 (b) The individual identified in (1)(b), shall Chair the Ad Hoc committee, but shall
42 not have any voting rights associated with the duties and responsibilities of this
43 Ad Hoc committee.

44 (3)(a) A majority of members, or at least five committee members if notice of meeting is
45 provided at least two weeks in advance, constitute a quorum.

46 (b) The action of the majority of a quorum constitutes the action of the Ad Hoc
47 committee.

48 (c) The Ad Hoc committee shall use Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised, 11th
49 Edition, as its parliamentary resource.

50 (4) Staffing resources will be made available for Ad Hoc committee support as available.
51 The Ad Hoc committee should appoint a member of the committee as Secretary.

52 (5) The Ad Hoc committee shall:

53 (a) Provide for youth and community engagement by planning, organizing, and
54 executing opportunities at Utah County-based venues representing the UCRP
55 where participants may receive information on the UCRP Platform, the
56 Caucus/ Convention System, and other appropriate UCRP materials
57 designated by the Ad Hoc committee and approved by the UCRP Steering
58 Committee;

59 (b) Provide locations at Ad Hoc committee associated events for the registration
60 of voters;

- 61 (c) Plan, organize, and execute at least one event that attracts at least 25
62 unaffiliated or non-Republican voters, with the approval of the Steering
63 Committee;
- 64 (d) Plan, organize, and execute at least one event per 12 month period at the
65 Brigham Young University campus, and also, the Utah Valley University
66 campus to meet with campus Republicans, with the objective of providing
67 UCRP materials designated by the Ad Hoc committee and approved by the
68 UCRP Steering Committee;
- 69 (e) Design and implement a plan to create a “Teen-Age Republicans” chapter at
70 each of the high schools, and high school-level public charter schools,
71 throughout Utah County;
- 72 (f) Schedule opportunities for members of the UCRP Steering Committee and
73 UCRP Executive Committee to meet with at least 20 teens during at least two
74 meetings with individual chapters;
- 75 (g) Provide proposals to the Steering Committee for youth related social media-
76 based “contests” to endorse, promote, and educate teens and the community on
77 Republican principles and activities;
- 78 (h) Develop a budget proposal for review and approval by the Steering Committee
79 for Ad Hoc committee income and expenses; and,
- 80 (i) Address other pertinent projects and events agreed to between the UCRP
81 Chair and the Ad Hoc committee Chair.

82 (6)(a) Meetings will be held at the call of the Chair, or by a vote of at least five members
83 of the Ad Hoc committee.

84 (b) Meetings may be held electronically utilizing an electronic conferencing
85 system, approved by the UCRP Steering Committee, if all members participating
86 can hear each other and participate in discussion.

87 (7) The Ad Hoc committee shall coordinate its efforts and activities with the UCRP
88 Education Officer.

89 (8) Periodic reports, as well as a final report, shall be presented to the UCRP Steering
90 Committee and the UCRP Executive Committee for their reference and use.

92 **Effective date.**

93 This Ad Hoc committee takes effect on July 1, 2015 and automatically ceases to exist
94 following its final report as specified in (8) above, two weeks after the UCRP 2017
95 Organizing Convention, or upon the written notification from the UCRP Chairman,
96 whichever occurs first.
